- Faculties are also encouraged to present paper in international /national seminar /conferences.

Seminar/Special Talks:

Department of Bengali organized a Two Days National level Seminar funded by UGC in this academic year.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation:

- Upgrading and expansion of the laboratories is continued.

- Different committees and cells are formed viz. Students' Welfare Committee, Students' Attendance Committee, Disciplinary Committee, Grievance Redressal Cell etc. to take care of academic and social environment of the College.
- Different wings of the Students' Union viz. Games and Sports Unit, Cultural Unit, Students' Welfare Unit perform several activities under the guidance of teachers.
