9.Objectives of the Field work



Later on, door-to-door questionnaire survey done in different parts of the village done. During the field trip, landuse survey, G.P.S. survey, Dumpy Level survey, long and cross profile of Benia river, tourist survey, market survey, traffic survey and hotel survey done by the students. Later on, students were taught and asked to prepare master data table based on which they prepared essentials data tables and cartographic diagrams and wrote their field work report. Overall, the field excursion was very fruitful. Field trips serve one vital function as far as education is concerned.


9.Objectives of the Field work



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

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
